GATHERING IN PRAISE

Greetings

First reader: The prophet Malachi calls us to watch for the messenger God will send us, a messenger who burns with a passion for God's coming salvation. "For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the LORD in righteousness" (Malachi 3:2b-

Community: In a world driven by a passion to maintain the status quo, we choose to live with a passion for God's peace, to listen to those who call us to righteousness, and to submit ourselves to God's grace, that we might be refined and purified until we reflect God's love throughout the earth.

Second reader: We light this candle of peace as a sign of our commitment to passionately pursue the work of making peace in our hearts, our families, our communities, and throughout the earth until God's kingdom comes on earth as it is in heaven.

+Confession and Forgiveness

Presider: Blessed be the holy Trinity, one God who forgives all our sins, whose mercy endures forever. Amen.

The presider may lead the prayer of preparation.

Presider: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you and magnify your Holy Name, through Jesus Christ our lord. Presider: Let us confess our sins in the presence of God and of one another.

The community kneels or stands. Silence may be kept.

Community: Most merciful God, we confess that captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not love you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neibour as ourselves. For the sake of your son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us,

Presider: A Let us stand and confess our faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed.

Heal and comfort those we hold in our hearts and those who have asked for our prayers. We pray for the Staff and Garrett community and remember those others whom we name before you in our hearts or aloud at this time (especially). Bring hope to prisoners, refugees, and outsiders. Hear us, O God.

Community: Your mercy is great.

Intercessor: Strengthen marriages, families, and friendships with mutual love and respect. Bless our community as a place of support and care for healthy relationships. Hear us, O God.

Community: Your mercy is great.

Intercessor: Look with joy upon your children who are celebrating special anniversaries this week (especially) and all who rejoice this week, that their joy may be endless. Hear us, O God. Community: Your mercy is great.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

Intercessor: Rejoicing in the promise of the heavenly banquet, we give thanks for all those who have died in faith. Join us, with them, at the resurrection of the righteous. Hear us, O God.

Community: Your mercy is great.

Intercessor: We lift our prayers to you, O God, trusting your promise to hear us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Greetings of Peace

Presider: The peace of Christ be with you always.

Community: And also with you.

During the Sharing of the Peace, the Communion Stewards will join the Presider at the table to the north of the communion table to wash their hands. They will remain on the side as the Presider returns to the table to proceed with the Communion liturgy.

Stand.

Presider: The Lord be with you. Community And also with you. Presider: Lift up your hearts.

Community: We lift them to the Lord.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Community: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

PREFACE

Presider: It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O Lord, holy Father, through Christ our Lord; who on this day overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. And so, with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

We praise you, all-holy God, our maker, our lover, our keeper, nurturing our past, our present, our future; for the universe beyond our knowing, for seas and forests and fields, for the Atlantic, the Pacific, and a continent between; for creatures seen and unseen, for animals both wild and tame, for our ancestors from many cultures; and for the places we humans call home, for cities and churches and schools. We praise you for your covenant people, for Moses and Miriam and Aaron, and for centuries of faithful Christians, for Mary Magdalene, Peter and Paul, for Francis, Bach, Martin Luther King, Jr. We praise you for your Son, O God, who saves us from sin and from evil, who continues to lead us to new life.

Presider may hold hands over the bread, or touch or lift the bread.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Presider may hold hands over the cup, or touch or lift the cup.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. And so we remember your Son, his life, his death, and his glorious resurrection, his word, and his presence in this meal, and we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Memorial Acclamation Christ has Died #2257-c TFWS.

Presider may raise hands.

We pray that you send your Spirit, your breath, your fire, your wisdom, your guidance everywhere in the church. Send your Spirit upon this bread and cup; inspire your people for service, and renew the world with your mercy, with your healing, your justice and your peace, reconciling us with you and our neighbors. We praise you, all-holy God, the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit, Abba, Living Water, Breath of Life, today, tomorrow and forever.
