SERVICE OF WORD AND TABLE

For the Third Sunday of Advent

Greetings

We gather today to light the third candle known as the candle of joy. This third candle symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent, we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

First reader: No matter what troubles overwhelm us today, Isaiah reminds us that in all of our preparation and passionate pursuit of God's coming kingdom, we must not forget that God's salvation has come and is coming. "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation" (Isaiah 12:3). With joy you will remember that God's salvation is already present among us.

Community: Faced with the troubles and the suffering of the world, we choose to live in joyful presence to God and one another. We will not turn away from the pain and the hurt in our world, and we will not stop rejoicing in God, whose salvation fills us to overflowing that God's love might flow through us and flood our troubled world with hope, peace, and joy.

Second reader: We light this candle of joy as a sign of our commitment to be present to ourselves, our friends, our families, and our neighbors that in sharing our vulnerable lives we might share in the glorious joy of God's salvation together.

Light the third (pink/rose) candle of the Advent wreath.¹

We ask that God hear the sound of our pleading and sustain us in our work in recognizing and affirming the beloved community. May we hold together the desperation we feel and the hope for which we long. Amen.²

GATHERING AT THE TABLE

+Invitation Presider

As we have lightened the third candlelight of the advent celebration, with dancing hearts, resilient spirits, and open minds, let us worship God as Christ our Lord invites to his table all who desire the warmth of God's love and long for the flourishing of a new life.

+Prayer of Confession & Pardon.

Rainbow-Raising God, who flew all the colors across the sky as an emblem of the promise to sustain life for all creation, we confess that our openness and affirmation has often had limits. For too long we have allowed PRIDE to be whitewashed, erasing the important dreams, visions and resistance of black trans femmes that forged a way forward for us all. Forgive our forgetfulness. For too long we have celebrated PRIDE for some of us, but not all of us. Forgive us when we use the rainbow flag to cover over the work, we have yet to do to demonstrate your fierce love for trans folx. Convict us with your grace, Transforming God, so that not one more anti-trans word will be spoken without our opposition. Until trans justice comes, we pray as we would live. Amen.³

Presider: Hear the good news: Christ died for us while we were yet sinners; that proves God's love toward us. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven!

Presider

During the Sharing of the Peace, the Communion Stewards will join the Presider at the table to the north of the communion table to wash their hands. They will remain on the side as the Presider returns to the table to proceed with the Communion liturgy.

We gather in this precious given space oh God and in this moment, we respond to the words of Jesus, who tells us: "...where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." And it is with the power of Christ that we proclaim that this table is open to all people — no matter who you are or what you believe or what you've been told. Here at the Lord's table, we remember the simple gathering of a chosen family that came together for a meal that proclaimed a new way of being in this world. We remember God's radically inclusive love made real in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We remember the One who befriended the forgotten, embraced the outcast, and saw the Image of God in all people. We remember the One who confronted every power that disconnected, marginalized, oppressed, and "other-ed." It is here at this table that we find hope and imagination to see God's dream and promise of a world of wholeness, and it is here that we receive the nourishment and strength to continue on the paths of justice.

Presider may hold hands over the bread, or touch or lift the bread.

We recall that on the night he was betrayed, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Presider may hold hands over the cup, or touch or lift the cup.

In the same way he took the cup, saying, "This is my blood, my very life, poured out for you. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Presider may raise hands.

Presider may hold hands, palms down, over the bread and cup.

God, we thank you for breathing this world into existence and proclaiming from its birth: "It is good." Through your Spirit, open our hearts to the joy we can find amid life's challenges. Remind us that we are loved — fiercely and forever.
